

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

COMING SOON:

A NEW ERA FOR NORTHERN BEAUFORT TRANSIT

Big things are happening at Palmetto Breeze! For the past nine months, we've been teaming up with the Lowcountry Council of Governments and RS&H (a consulting group from Savannah) on a major planning project with exciting potential for our region.

It's called the Northern Beaufort
County Transit Master Plan, and it's
focused on identifying unmet
transportation needs North of the
Broad. Once completed (expected this
October), the plan will recommend
new transit services—some of which
would be the first of their kind in the
Lowcountry!

This month, we're testing **proposed fixed routes** in the City of Beaufort,
Town of Port Royal, and nearby areas.
These routes were designed using
cutting-edge transit models that
consider traffic flow, trip frequency,
connections to other transportation,
geography, and feedback from both
stakeholders and the public.

One exciting idea on the table:

Microtransit—a flexible service using vans that riders could request through a mobile app (like Uber, but for public transit). It would operate in defined zones and link people to fixed routes. The plan might also suggest bikesharing stations, future ferry services, and new amenities like bus shelters or even a transfer station. Exciting opportunities are ahead for Palmetto Breeze, and they wouldn't be possible without you—let's keep the momentum going, team! Your hard work matters and I appreciate it. Keep bringing your best and helping us move transit forward. Huge thanks for all you do!
